SURVEY METHODOLOGY

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Sample	500 Black/ African American Los Angeles County Likely March 2024 Voters
Fielding Dates	January 20 – 27, 2024
Margin of Error	Full Sample: $\pm 4.37\%$ at the 95% Confidence Level
Data Collection Mode	Online
Weighting and Rounding	Results have been weighted to match the distribution of Black likely voters. All numbers are percentages, and may not sum precisely or to 100% due to rounding.



KEY FINDINGS

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1

A significant majority of Black voters believe **climate change is an extremely or very serious issue** facing Los Angeles County.

2

Black/African American voters are **highly cognizant of issues related to climate change and its disparate impacts on communities of color.** Voters believe that Black, Latino, and low-income communities will face **far worse impacts compared to White, wealthy, and coastal communities.**

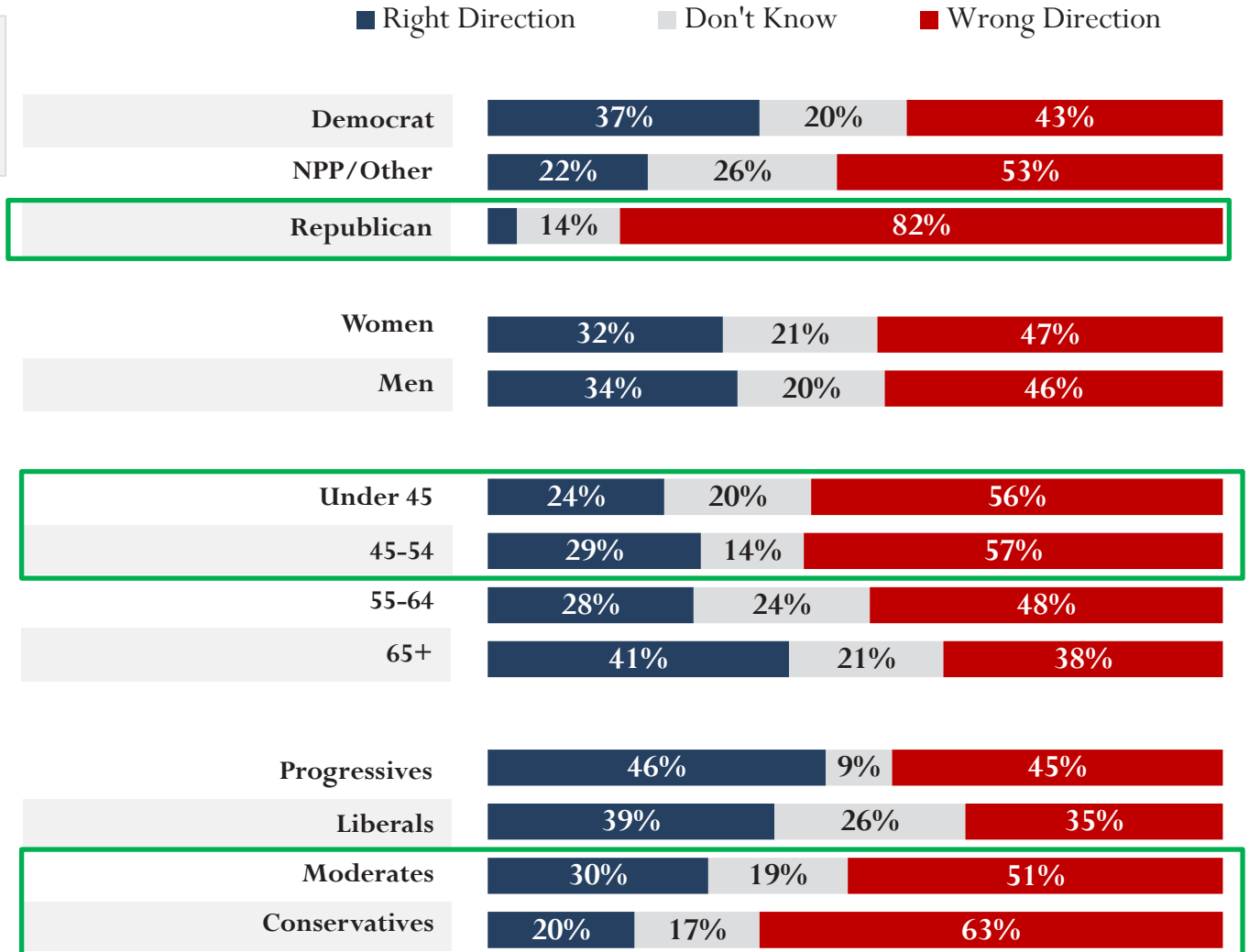
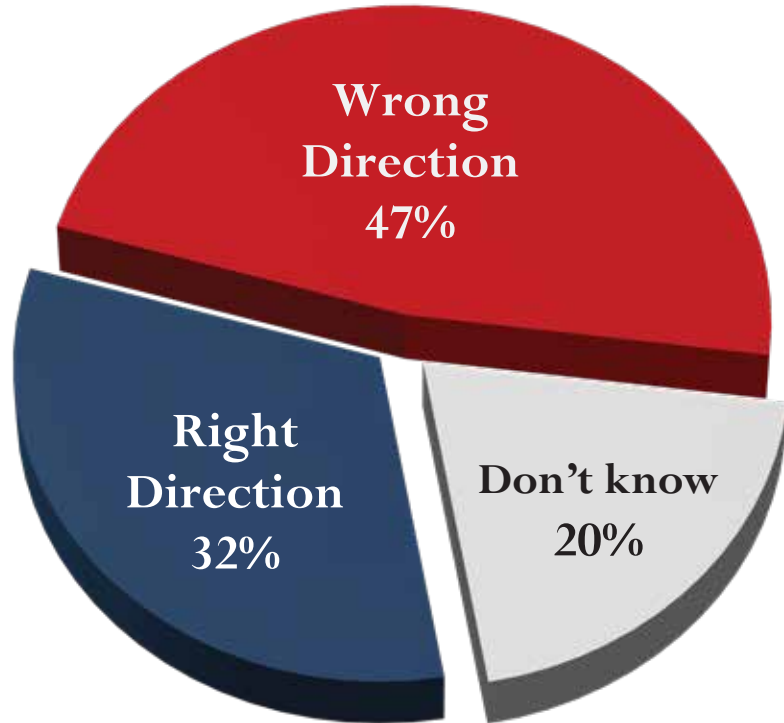

Black/African American voters see a **strong link between issues of climate change, environmental harm, and civil rights.** This suggests that voters are highly likely to support environmental justice policy as an issue of racial equity.

Q: Do you feel things in Los Angeles County are generally going in the right direction or they going in the wrong direction?*

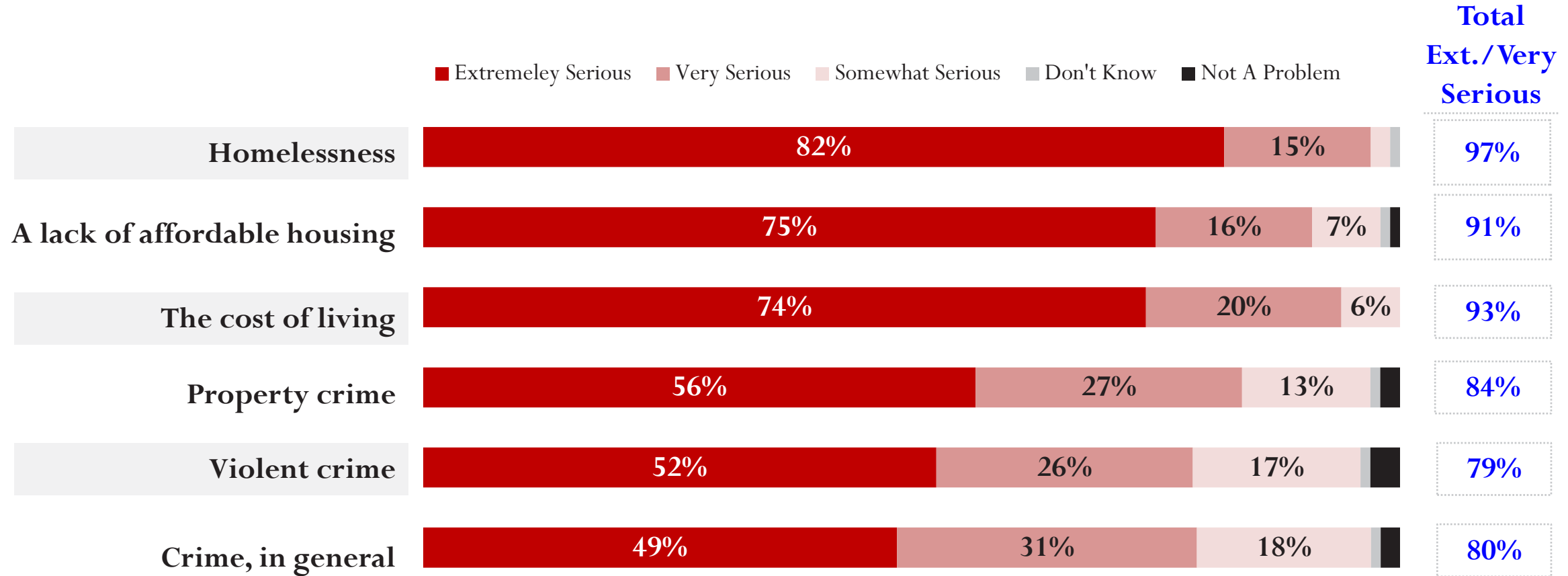

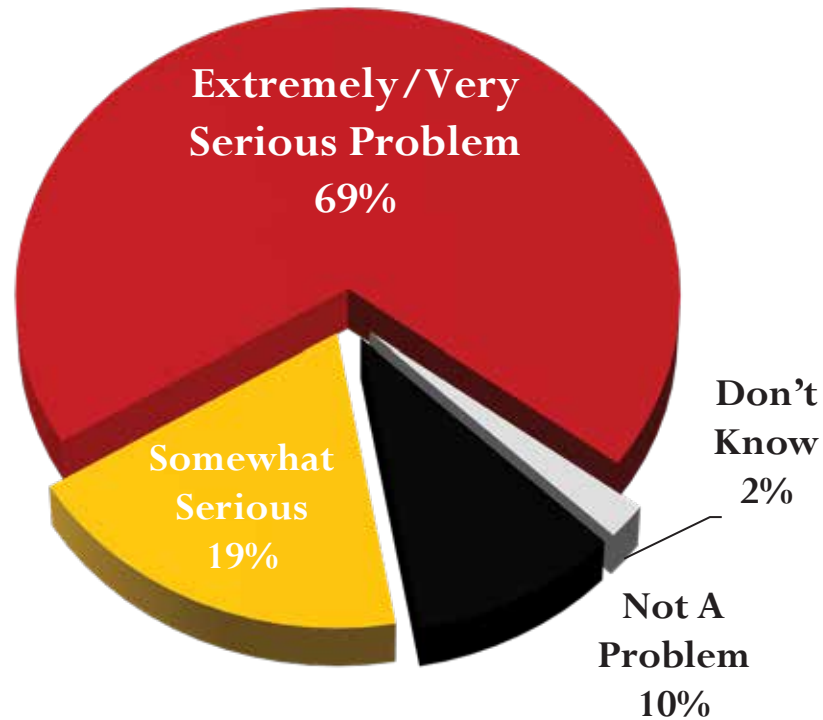


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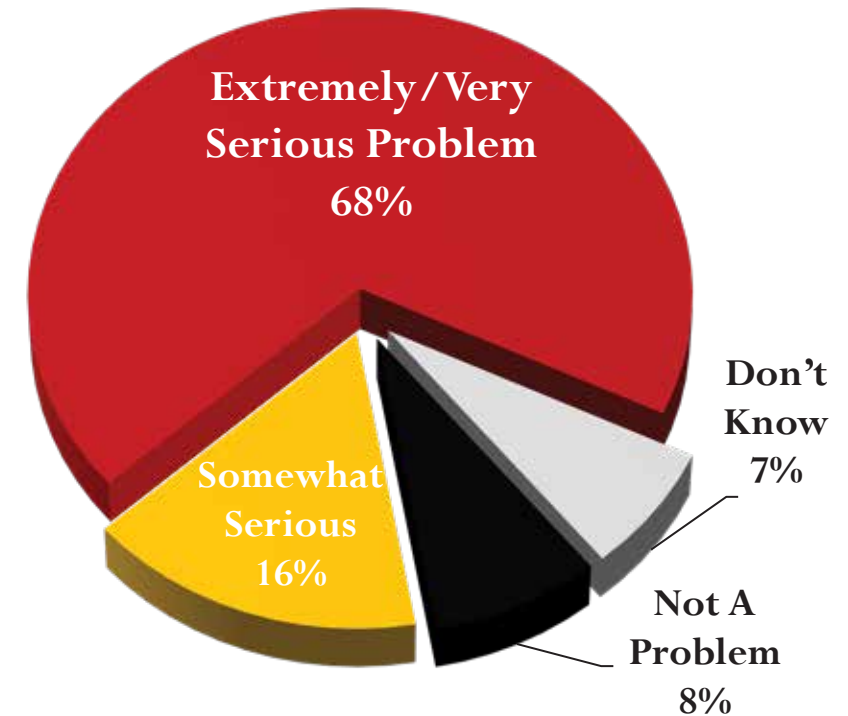

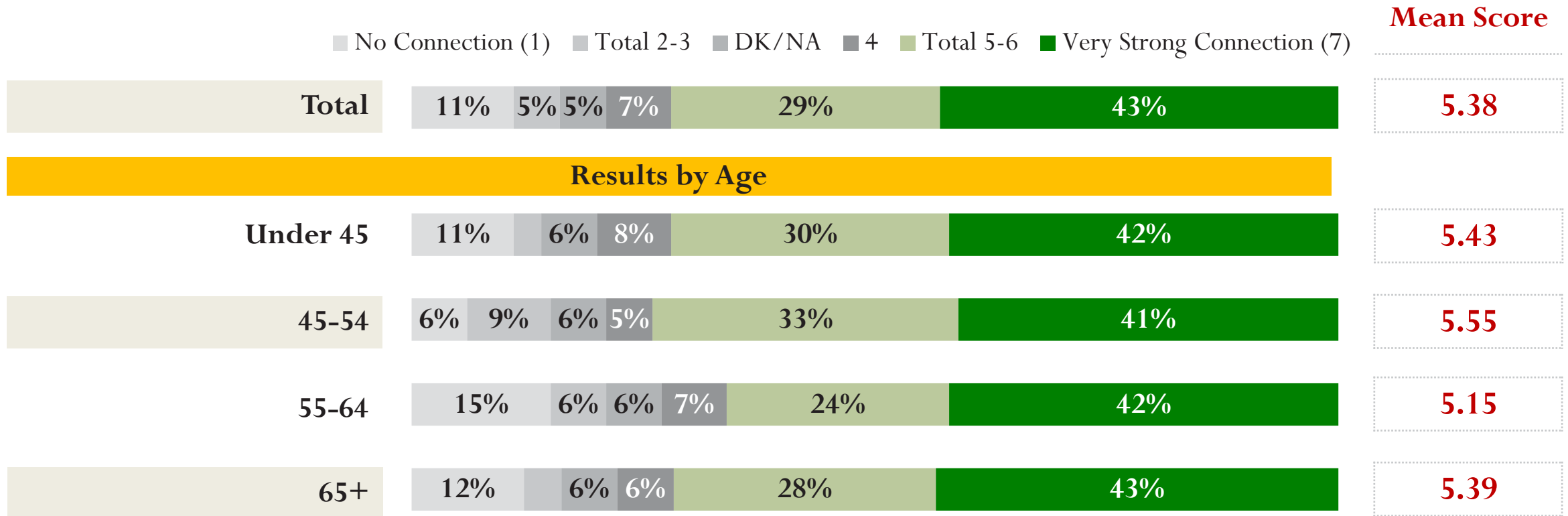


The disproportionate impact of climate change on communities of color

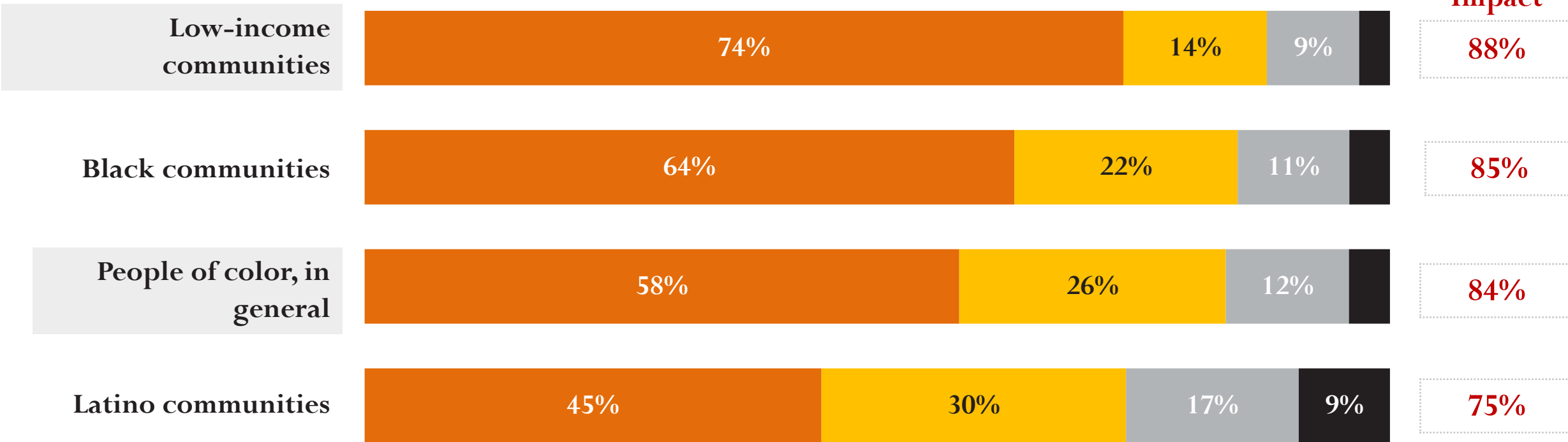

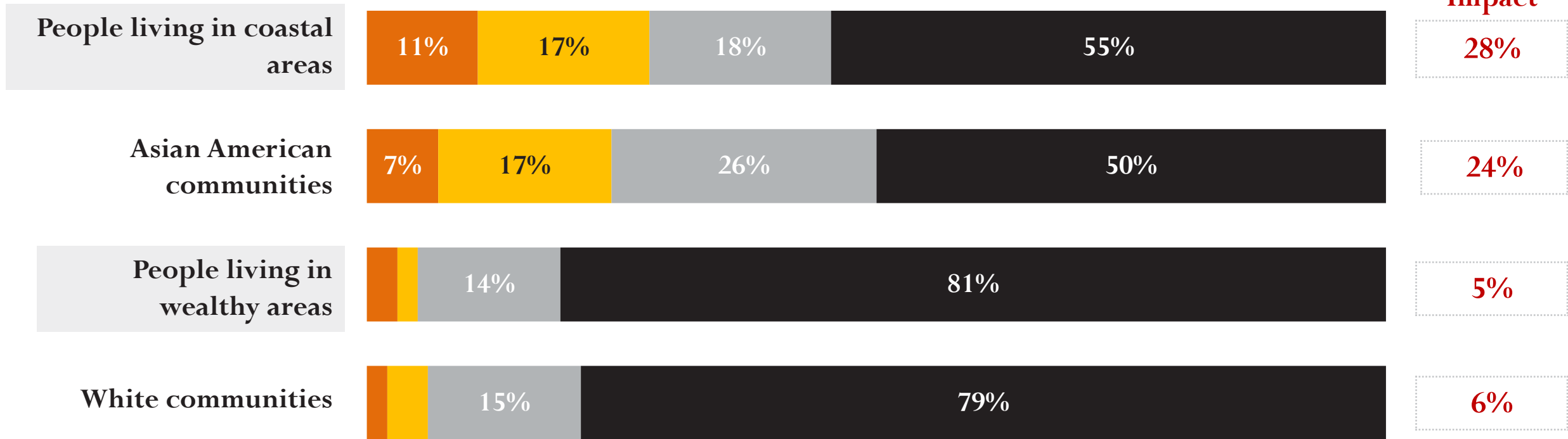
